The selected candidate will focus on building networks and violence awareness within male-serving groups and agencies through various strategies, including, public speaking, workshops, person engagement, social media campaigns, among others.

Key Responsibilities:

- Develop and implement outreach plan and strategies to engage men and boys in mental health and related violence initiatives.
- Build connections and partnerships with male-serving groups and agencies to increase awareness of available support services.
- Convene and facilitate a male-led advisory group to guide outreach efforts and ensure relevance to the target demographic.
- Develop and distribute outreach materials to effectively communicate CCC's services and resources to mean and boys.
- Organize and participate in outreach events, engagement activities, workshops, and public speaking engagements to raise awareness.
- Collaborate with community partners to reach men and boys "where they are" and ensure accessibility of services.
- Monitor and evaluate outreach efforts, including tracking engagement metrics and assessing the impact on mental health outcomes.
- Provide counselling support to male clients accessing CCC's services utilizing outcome measurement tools to track changes in mental health status.

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in social work, public health, psychology, or related field (master's degree preferred).
- Male with firsthand experience navigating mental health challenges, adept at forging genuine connections and providing empathetic support to men seeking assistance.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to build and maintain relationships with diverse stakeholders.
- Licensed practitioner status with professional body
- Pass a Police and Child Welfare check.
